The British Institute of Radiology (BIR) is proud to announce that the first issue of BJR|case reports, is available from today. The new journal will be published quarterly and as part of the BIR|Open initiative, all articles are open access and free for everyone to read as soon as they are published.

The first issue of BJR|case reports contains eight articles featuring the following topics: delayed diagnosis of lung cancer; stand up paddle surfer's myelopathy; Rosai–Dorfman disease of the breast; congenital nasal pyriform aperture stenosis; acute paraumbilical vein recanalization; the management of severe emphysematous pyelonephritis; granulomatous slack skin cutaneous T-cell lymphoma and benign periosteal chondroma seeding into bone.
