

Léa Coulet Appointed MNI Executive Director



Léa Coulet has been appointed the first Executive Director of The Medical Nutrition International Industry (MNI). Coulet brings to the MNI more than decade of experience in public affairs, specifically in the health prevention, health technology, global health and pharmaceutical sectors. She is a French citizen who has been based in Brussels since 2003.

The Brussels-based MNI was established in 2005 with the aim of optimising patient outcomes as they relate to nutritional interventions. One of its key goals is ensuring that patients who need such intervention have access to it, across care settings. MNI is the trade association for "companies providing products and services that support patient management and rehabilitation by the appropriate use of specialised nutritional solutions, including both parenteral and enteral nutrition," according to its website.

"Medical nutrition is a dynamic and innovative sector in healthcare and is gaining recognition for its growing role in addressing a wide spectrum of healthcare challenges," said Coulet. "Currently, we are engaged in strategic initiatives arising in Europe, Asia and Latin America and I am committed to ensure our industry has a clear and convincing voice in tune with our growing contribution to health."
